As offers go, Danielle Cormack counts her invitation by a Bedouin sheik to join his six-strong harem as her most interesting yet; that is, unless you count the one by a Berber family to one of their sons, in Morocco.

In Syria filming her trip for TVNZ travel show Intrepid Journeys, the award-winning actress was propositioned by the sheik in return for some camels. However the Berber family were more subtle and asked her to try on a traditional wedding gown. Danielle guessed their game (she'd met the obviously eligible son) and declined.

It's no surprise that the gorgeous and talented actor is in demand. Shortland St fans will remember Danielle as the popular - and famously jilted - nurse Alison Rayner. She also appeared in the 1980s series Gloss. However, TV soaps are just a small part of what has become a sizeable acting CV.

She's racked up up roles in numerous local and offshore productions, such as feature films Topless Women Talk About Their Lives (for which she won a local best actress award) and Via Satellite, and the popular TV shows Xena, Warrior Princess, and Maddigan's Quest. She's also received critical acclaim for her one-woman stage performance as New Zealand's most famous and enigmatic author, Katherine Mansfield, and across the ditch, won praise for her role as Lenka in the Melbourne Theatre Company's production of the Tom Stoppard play Rock 'n Roll. And she won best actress at the Fantasporto International Film Festival 2000 in Portugal for her role in Australian film Siam Sunset.

Danielle loves a good laugh and her quick wit and warm personality make her in-demand as MC and presenter at corporate events. She's crowd-wrangled at events such as the L' Oréal Professionnel Colour Trophy Awards, the New Zealand Music Awards, and a celebrity debate to raise money for the Breast Cancer Research Trust. And, if you ask nicely, she may even sing, something she did with a couple of fellow actors to earn extra cash and keep fans entertained at Xena conventions. Note: rock 'n roll requests preferred, and she does a mean Janis Joplin.

She's not just a rock chick though, having established and for two years hosted weekly dub show High Noon Tea on radio station KiwiFM. And if you're into experimental music set to poetry give her a call; she and friend Johnny Brugh have just set up a band called Bob Geldof (they aim to lure Sir Bob into performing one day)

An inspirational and down-to-earth speaker, she's told her story at high schools and performing arts schools, giving an insider's view of performance and of the industry.

She does her bit for charitable causes, stepping up as MC for several charity bashes held by the Raukauri Music Therapy Trust, a children's charity, and organising and hosting a fundraiser art auction for Rape Crisis. She also sponsors two children in Brazil and Uganda through the ChildFund.
